Small Group Questions
Week of January 14, 2018

Icebreaker:

If you could be in charge of the world, what would you do?

Read:

Genesis 3 (passages that make reference to Satan: Isaiah 14:12-14; Ezekiel 28:12-18; Luke 10:18; Romans 3:9-12, 23; 5:12-19).

Discussion Questions:

1. Review the one reason that was given as to why Adam and Eve might have chosen to sin?
How is this similar to our choosing to sin against God today?
2. How does Chapter 3 of Genesis and sin’s absolutes explain the state of the world today?
3. Why is a “good” done by someone who is not a Christian, actually not truly good (Romans 3:12)?
Who can truly do good? When is a “good” done by a Christian truly good?
4. Why do you think people will talk about there being “evil” or about people doing evil things, but not admit there is sin in our world and in each of us?
5. Why is reflecting on and confessing our sins to God an important spiritual discipline?
How often would you say you practice this discipline, or do you just ask for forgiveness in the after fact of a sin?
6. Take time as a group to come before God and individually (and privately) reflect on, confess and ask God’s forgiveness for your sins.
After a time have someone read aloud to the group 1 John 1:8-9.
