A Note from Pastor Jim: Our vision for global missions (as well as local missions) is to not only give financial support to missionaries or mission organizations but to be personally engaged with the churches, pastors and people of a particular city or country. We feel strongly that a global mission should be one where we are investing both our people resources as well as financial resources. So when we consider our commitment to each of our three "tiers" (see below for the definitions of our tiers) we do so through that kind of matrix. In the past three years, the *Hands & Feet Project* in Haiti has been shifting their mission strategy in a different direction, working less with local churches and pastors and working more toward creating economic change in the country. While their vision is an amazing one and we pray for their success, it no longer matches what we value most in a mission partner.

In the February Pulse, we shared with you our new Tier 2 mission, [El Puente Granada Christian Education Center](#) in Granada, Nicaragua. El Puente (The Bridge) is a local church with which Granada Christian Education Center partners. This ministry church reaches out to children, families and people affected by drug addiction and alcoholism in the community. They place a strong value on discipling, equipping pastors and leaders, and partnering with short-term mission teams from the U.S. They are a great match for us and we look forward to sending our first young adult team there this summer (August 7-14).

If you haven't gone on a Global Missions trip, and you are in good health, I want to encourage you to prayerfully consider joining one of our teams. There are different kinds of teams with different tasks but all of them emphasize creating personal relationships with the churches, pastors, and mission teams in those countries. ## Centerpoint Team Makes Final Mission Trip To Haiti

The following is an excerpt from an article written by Haiti Team member, Phil Kelly, reporting on Centerpoint's final mission trip to the Hands and Feet Project. For the full article, visit the [Centerpoint website Missions page](#):

*Eight adults from Centerpoint spent a week in Haiti from January 16-23 with the Hands & Feet Project. Haiti is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere. It is estimated that there are over a million orphans, and a large portion of them are the result of separation due to extreme poverty. The Hands and Feet Project is a non-profit organization dedicated to providing family-style residential care for children in crisis. We were able to visit the awesome care facilities in the cities of Grand Goave and Jacmel to witness the life-changing work being done.*

*Each day was filled with special moments, including visiting "Haiti Made," an enterprise to provide employment to Haitians. We gained insights into basic life needs by walking through the Grand Goave market. This was a very large, crowded farmer's market situated on a dirt lot with narrow rambling pathways and stalls constructed from whatever stray bits of rock, wood, wire, tin, and plastic you could drag from post-earthquake destruction. We traveled a twisty, mountainous drive to the city of Jacmel and pondered how people in remote mountain villages walk many hours to get their wares to the Grand Goave market. We walked through communities where homes are barely more than a tin roof and makeshift walls. We heard from Tony, the coffee guy, who for the last 12 years has been introducing Jesus to people in remote mountain villages. We met long-term missionaries and saw the loving work they are doing. We participated in a church service with energetic, praiseful singing in Creole and English and we saw beaches and views whose beauty took our breath away. We were blessed to serve and be served and for the opportunity to build relationships in Haiti.*




Join us for the ACRES OF HOPE WORKDAY on Saturday, April 21!



*We are pleased to welcome our new Associate Pastor, Bryan Yeo. Bryan began his ministry at Centerpoint on March 5 and will be focusing on the areas of missions, adult education and student ministries. Here's some excerpts from the recent congregational letter:*

Bryan grew up attending Centerpoint with his family and came to know Jesus at about 8 years old. He grew in his faith during jr. high and high school under the leadership of mentors, youth pastors and coaches. Centerpoint was a key part of his high school experience through Bible studies, summer & winter camps and Mexico mission trips.

After high school, Bryan attended UCLA and was heavily involved in Campus Crusade for Christ (CRU) and his local church. While working with CRU and serving with Centerpoint's high school ministry during the summers, he received the Lord's call to full-time ministry. He spent the next three years earning his Master of Theology (ThM) at Dallas Theological Seminary.
